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HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS OF *Moscow*

WHERE IT ALL STARTED

The land was originally occupied by the Palus tribe, renowned as expert equestrians. The source of the word Palouse most likely comes from the name of the major village of the Palouse Indians. The name is the Sehaptin (Indian) word for the village, "palus", which means "something sticking down in the water." The village was located at the confluence of the Palouse and Snake Rivers, and the something sticking down in the water was a large rock. The Palouse believed the rock to be a solidified heart of Beaver, who played an important role in their religious beliefs.

Settlers arrived in 1871 to homestead or buy the abundant government-owned prairie grasslands so valuable for farming. In 1875, the city's first store was opened on what is now Main Street. Moscow was incorporated in 1887 followed by the creation of Latah County in 1888 with



Moscow as the county seat. In 1889 Moscow was chosen as the site for a land-grant institution, the University of Idaho, which propelled the city into a trading and population center for the county. Idaho achieved statehood in 1890. Today, mesmerizing beauty and a sweeping landscape of

MOSCOW HOTEL

Moscow's first hotel, which sat on the northwest corner of Main and Fourth Street, was a two-story frame structure. Like so many western towns during that era, a fire destroyed the hotel in 1890. The owner rebuilt quickly, this time constructing an impressive three-story brick hotel. "The Moscow" was known as a fine hotel and gathering place. In the middle of the 20th century, the upper floors of the hotel were converted to apartments while the lower floor was reserved for retail and a bar. Today the building is owned by local entrepreneurs and restaurateurs committed to preserving the site's historic character while creating spaces that meet Moscow's contemporary needs.

rolling hills greet visitors to this distinctive region. This is the place to drive leisurely along the gently curving highways, sprinkled with antique shops and wineries, with a scene set for outdoor recreation and photography. If you ever needed to stop the world and relax, this is the place for it. ■



APPALOOSA HORSE MUSEUM

The Appaloosa Museum is located in the heart of Palouse Country – home of the Appaloosa horse breed. The museum is a nonprofit organization established to collect, preserve, study, and exhibit objects and information that illustrate the history of the Appaloosa horse. The museum's facility includes an exhibit area, theater, hands-on kid's area, library and an archive featuring books, magazines, videos, and gift shop. Exhibit themes range from the early evidence of spotted horses in art and literature, to the relationship between the Appaloosa and the Nez Perce Indians, and highlights of the modern Appaloosa Horse Club.

LATAH COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Located across the street from the McConnell Mansion, Latah County Historical Society has been dedicated to preserving and promoting local history. It maintains a community archive that includes historic photos and documents, a library of hard to find publications, and a collection of artifacts and clothing. Anyone with an interest in learning more about Latah County and its towns is welcome to visit the research office. The society offers a variety of educational and entertaining programs.

MCCONNELL MANSION

The McConnell Mansion is so named for the family that had it built in 1886. At the time of its construction, it was one of the most striking homes in the growing community and was the first building on the block. The family patriarch, William J. McConnell, was an enterprising man who opened a retail store at the corner of Main and First Streets in a building that also bears his name. McConnell went on to become the third governor of Idaho. The final private owner of the home, gifted the building to Latah County. Latah County Historical Society operates a free museum within the historic home. A visit offers guests the chance to step back in time and consider life during Moscow's earliest years. Visit the historical society's website to schedule your tour.

THE PLACE TO PLAY

Our vibrant and historic downtown is home to galleries, theaters, fine dining, festivals, and Idaho's #1 Farmer's Market. Our trees stay lit year round to celebrate our fun and festive atmosphere, created by our spirited entrepreneurs and passionate city residents. Downtown is the heart of our community and no matter what time of year you visit you will be sure to experience and enjoy the Magic of Moscow. ■

FARMER'S MARKET

The Farmer's Market began as a Moscow Food Co-Op venture in 1976. Today it hosts over 100 vendors and is rated one of the top farmers markets in the nation by American Farmland Trust. The mission of the Market is to celebrate life on the Palouse by providing the community with the opportunity to buy and sell locally grown farm and food products and distinctive handmade goods. The Market operates Saturdays May through October, 8am - 1pm on Main St. between 3rd and 6th streets.

FRIENDSHIP SQUARE

The heart of our community can be found in Friendship Square. Toss a coin in the fountain or let the kids play at the playground. During the Farmer's Market and other community events, Friendship Square is the feature location for bands and group meetups.



MOSCOW FOOD CO-OP

The Moscow Food Co-Op is one of our downtown staples! Our co-op was established in 1973 by friends Rod Davis, Jim Eagan, and Dave and Katie Mosel and was originally called the "Good Food Store." The small storefront shared products like peas, lentils, cheese, and spices sold in bulk with minimal packaging. This first store was run completely by volunteers.

Step into The Co-Op today and you'll see that here, "local" really has a definition – the product must be from Idaho, Washington, or within 250 miles of the store. They pride themselves on having strong relationships with more than 150 local food and goods producers. The personal connections with these farmers and business owners are what keep the Co-Op truly unique to the Palouse.

You can find handmade jewelry, locally-roasted coffee, fresh baked biscotti, your newest favorite Idaho beer, and famous house-made brats and sausages.

The Co-Op also invests in our community by offering monthly grants to community organizations. They are a champion of the local food system and regional economy, and believe supporting "local" truly means investing in the future of our community.

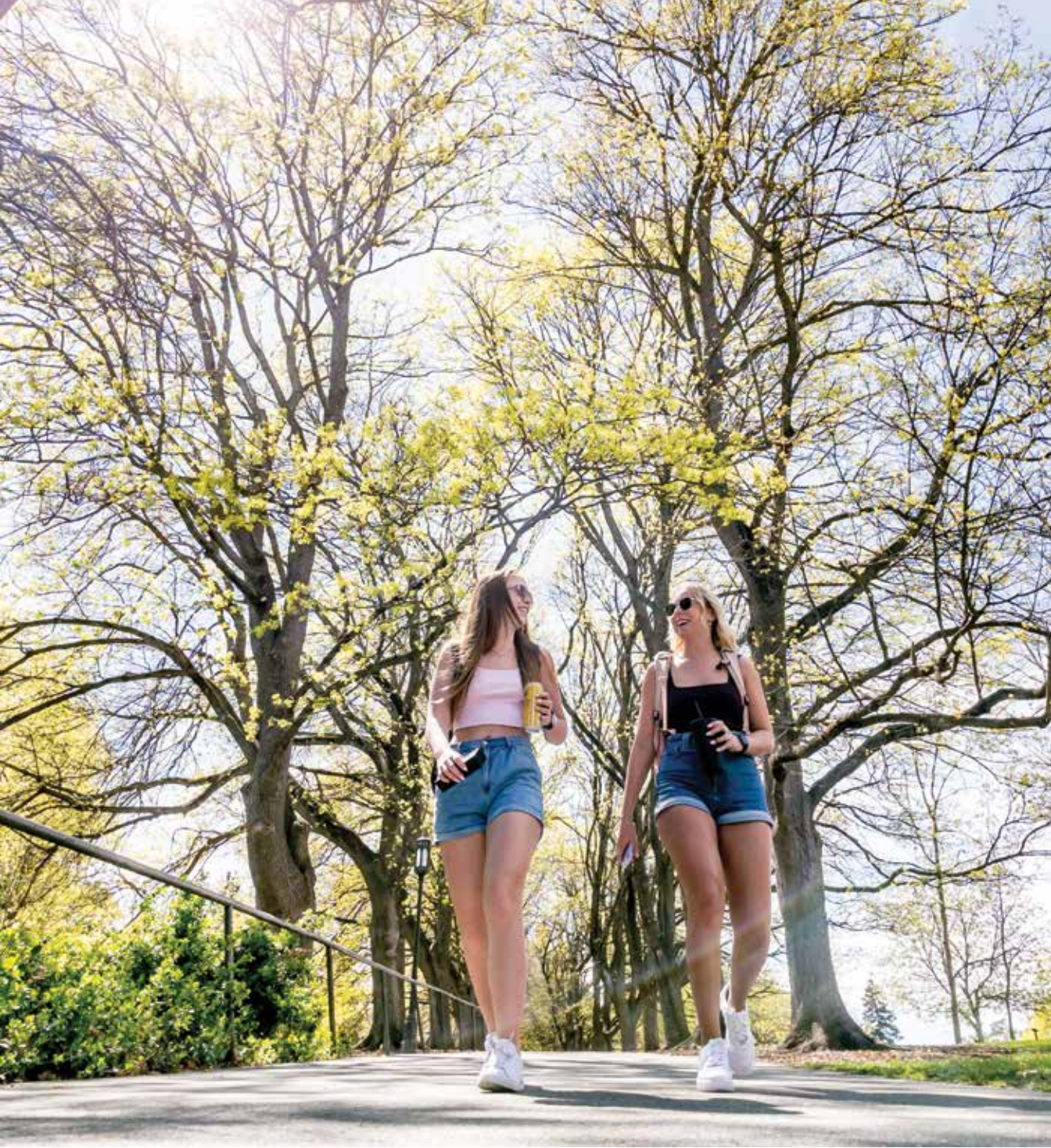

GETTING AROUND

Moscow is easily accessible via the north-south routes of U.S. Highway 195 in Washington, and U.S. Highway 95 in Idaho. Moscow and Pullman are linked by state Highway 270. Or fly into the Pullman/Moscow Airport, just 7 miles from town, on our newly renovated runway.

There are many ways to get around our community. Travel around using SMART Transit or catch a cab. You could even rent a bike from Paradise Creek Bicycles. Our region has 36 miles of paved trails, so you can walk, run, or bike everywhere that you need to go!

Moscow is Idaho's most walkable city. The beautiful University of Idaho campus to the tree-lined streets of downtown and the biking and walking paths that connect the heart of the city to the surrounding communities.

Moscow offers free public transportation through the SMART Transit bus system, with two overlapping routes through Moscow’s eastside to the University of Idaho campus and through the western route to the commercial areas. SMART Transit allows you to walk or ride as you need, giving you flexibility to explore the city.

Bike rentals are available at several local bike shops. You can rent a cruiser or an e-bike to check out the the town and incredible bike paths throughout the region. The Best Western Plus University Inn and the Fairfield Inn provide bike rentals to hotel guests.

You'll find inspired and unique options, including award-winning eateries, local favorites and ethnic dining. Our bars, breweries, wineries, and hangouts offer a range of options to quench your thirst. ■

NECTAR

Nectar, opened by Nikki and Brett Woodland in 2007, features a small, focused menu with globally-inspired Pacific Northwest flair, a curated wine selection, and an alluring craft cocktail bar. Nectar's menu holds true to long-standing local favorites such as their filet mignon with Bordelaise and fingerling potatoes, grilled meatloaf wrapped in bacon, and creamy rich homemade mac & cheese, highlighted by dynamic, seasonal specials. Nectar has developed a reputation for its diverse and ever-changing list of innovative craft cocktails and twists on traditional favorites. The wine menu features local selections, from the Lewis-Clark Valley to Walla Walla as well as other New World cult classics and unique European blends.

The Woodlands continue to own and operate the restaurant as they enter their sixteenth year serving the Palouse. Owner, Brett Woodland, states, "Nectar is built on and continues to succeed because of the passion of Moscow's community," and the staff could not agree more. Current general manager, Amanda Harlow says, "Moscow has changed the way I approach hospitality. Serving at Nectar feels like hosting friends in my own home." Nectar is proud to function as a community hub for Moscow locals, sharing compassion through food and libations. ■

MAIALINA

The centerpiece of Maialina's kitchen is its oven, imported from Italy, made from refractory Cotto brick which cooks pizzas at 900°. They stretch their mozzarella by hand, obsess daily about their dough and make it with a starter they've had since they opened. The owners studied at one of three Vera Pizza Napoletana certified schools in the world to learn how to preserve the traditional Naples style techniques.



The wine menu is exclusively Italian, representing the beautiful regions of Italy from north to south with creative wine flights. House-made colorful gelato ice creams are inspired by northwest seasonality and classic Italian flavors. The espresso is organic and custom blended to compliment the menu. During the summer, the magical piazza-style patio overflows with growing basil, tomatoes, herbs, corkscrew willow trees planted in wine barrels, and the laughs of friends.

Local farmers, ranchers, and growers make Maialina possible. Which is why their eggs, pork, beef, and many weekly hand truckloads of produce come straight from Moscow area family farms. They know their farmers and love what they do for the Moscow community. The team at Maialina considers it a great honor to prepare and serve these lovely things to their guests and share their tradition and love of place.

HUMBLE BURGER

A dining staple in Moscow, Humble Burger got their start at the Moscow Farmer's Market and opened their brick-and-mortar location the following year. Nearly everything on the menu is made from scratch using locally-sourced ingredients including beef, ground fresh daily.

Local Tip: HB is known for hosting live music for all ages. Check their schedule to find out when the next show is happening!

KARMA INDIAN CUISINE

A true feast for the senses. Mouthwatering aromas greet you as you enter Karma Indian Cuisine. Dishes arrive in an array of vibrant colors from the spectacular orange of the butter chicken to the deep green of the saag paneer, prefacing the rich deep flavors that follow.

Local Tip: Keep coming back until you've tried everything on the menu.

LA CASA LOPEZ

This vibrant family-friendly and family-operated Mexican restaurant has been a Moscow staple for decades. Each menu item is made from scratch, and if you're lucky enough, your meal may even be prepared by the family matriarch, Abuelita Lupita. Mouthwatering carne asada, pollo a la creme, and sizzling fajitas highlight an authentic, flavor-packed menu.

Local Tip: Their Scratch Margarita is a must-have!

MIKEY'S GYROS

Restaurants come and go, but every once and a while a gyro shack pops with that certain pizzazz. That certain combination of made-from-scratch food at ridiculously low prices, kitschy decor, and fast and friendly service. And, of course, ice-cold local beer.

Local Tip: You can't beat the warmed pita for a quick snack!

Locally-owned and operated, One World Café offers cozy and spacious indoor and outdoor seating options. Visit in the morning for some freshly brewed Landgrove Coffee or a bubbly mimosa. HUNGA DUNGA BREWING COMPANY

Hunga Dunga is a modern take on the tried-and-true pub and brewery. Beers pour from locally crafted tap handles. Their signature brew, Hazy Hopnipotent IPA, is a fan favorite. Hunga Dunga Brewery is a shining star in the Inland Northwest's microbrewery scene.

DISCOVER AN ADVENTURE

Moscow has no shortage of things to do and places to explore. With stunning rolling hills, a namesake mountain, and plenty of fishing holes, Moscow is a picturesque destination for outdoor recreation. Throughout the year, visitors and residents alike enjoy our selection of parks, campsites, and gardens as well as indoor activities such as ice skating, roller skating, rock climbing, and aquatics. ■

MOSCOW MOUNTAIN

Moscow Mountain overlooks the city with a bird's-eye view of the Palouse countryside. Travel the gravel and dirt roads as they wind around the ridge with beautiful flora and fauna in the unspoiled countryside. From northeast Moscow, follow Mountain View Road to a variety of scenic viewpoints.

Almost all of Moscow Mountain's 60+ miles of trails are on privately owned land. We have access to them because of the generosity of the landowners, and our relationships with them.

MAMBA (Moscow Area Mountain Bike Association) is a group of mountain bikers, hikers, runners, nordic skiers, and other non-motorized users who build and maintain a network of trails on and around Moscow Mountain.

ED CORKILL MEMORIAL TRAIL

While a great beginner trail, the distances on the Ed Corkill Memory trail vary. It begins near Kendrick High School and runs along State Highway 3 and scenic Potlatch Creek.



ELK CREEK FALLS RECREATION AREA

Elk Creek Falls Recreation Area is 54 miles east of Moscow. A series of cascades plunge almost 300 feet into a forest canyon. The hike into the falls is under one mile on a clearly marked trail.

IDLER'S REST CONSERVATORY

This beautiful conservatory, just northeast of Moscow, offers idyllic woods adjacent to Palouse farmland. You can also cross over the road and hike the trails beyond the creek. Idler's rest is ADA accessible and a great location for a fun family outing.

KAMIAK BUTTE COUNTY PARK

Offering visitors shaded picnic areas, shelters, playground facility, campground (*mid-April through mid-October*), trails and a breathtaking view of the Palouse.

PALOUSE RECREATION TRAILS

These trails offer over 70 miles of paved pathway for walking, running, biking, and skating. **The Bill Chipman Palouse Trail** runs between Pullman and Moscow along Highway 270. The Chipman Trail connects with Moscow's **Paradise Path**, linking the U of I campus and downtown. **The Latah Trail** connects to Paradise Path and runs parallel to State Highway 8 between Moscow and Troy. **The Pullman Parks and Recreation Trail System** and **Downtown RiverWalk** connect with the Chipman Trail.

PCEI NATURE CENTER

The Nature Center is open from dawn to dusk seven days a week. Enjoy many features such as nature trails, accessible pathways, wetlands, outdoor art, sustainable living projects and more!

SNAKE RIVER TRAIL

An hour west of Moscow via Washington State Highway 194, this trail stretches from the bank of Almoda Creek through Boyer Park, to the base of Lower Granite Dam. It features handicap and non-motorized access as well as a series of interpretive signs.

TRAILS TO TRAVEL

UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO ARBORETUM AND BOTANICAL GARDEN

Organized into geographical groupings, this lush garden displays plantings of hundreds of species of trees, shrubs and a xeriscape garden. In addition to native Idaho species, there are over 120 dedicated trees and groves, trails, water features, and benches for enjoying Idaho's spectacular seasonal changes.

VIRGIL PHILLIPS FARM

Virgil Philips Farm is five miles north of Moscow off U.S. Highway 95. This 160-acre farm showcases two small ponds with ducks, frogs, salamanders, and turtles.

HELLS GATE STATE PARK

Hells Gate State Park borders the Snake River. It is the gateway into Hells Canyon, famous for being North America's deepest gorge. The campus contributes youth and vibrancy to the city making it a great place to stay



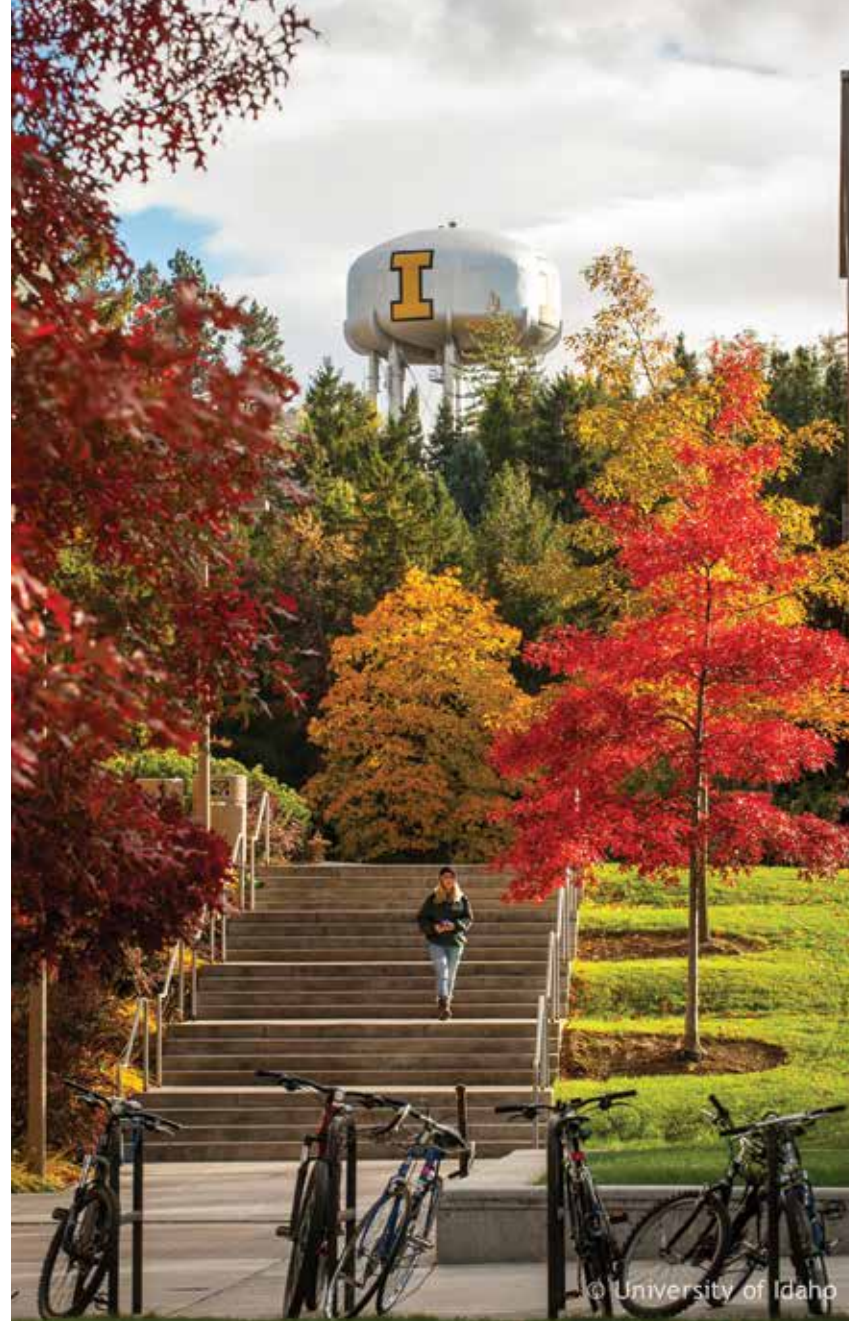

TOWNS FORGED IN TRADITION

Moscow has wonderful neighboring communities, and they offer a variety of great things to do, see, taste and experience. With some as close as fifteen minutes away across the Washington border or take a scenic 45 minute drive. Head out of town and explore more of what makes the Palouse so rich in tradition. ■

BOVILL, IDAHO 44 MINUTE DRIVE

The area around Bovill was first homesteaded in 1890, and around 1900, was purchased by a wealthy Englishman, Hugh Bovill. He and his family made Bovill their home, during which time they built a post office, general store, and a hotel to accommodate hunters and anglers. While lumber is the primary industry, Bovill is nestled in a beautiful mountain meadow, with opportunities for camping, hunting and fishing. Moose Creek Reservoir is a local favorite, offering a peaceful location for camping, fishing and recreation for the entire family. Camas Prairie Winery also has a tasting room located downtown.

DEARY, IDAHO 32 MINUTE DRIVE

The area around Deary was homesteaded, predominately by Scandinavians from the Midwest. In 1905, Potlatch Lumber Company decided to locate a station of the Washington, Idaho and Montana Railway here, and the company worked to establish a townsite. The mountain north of town that rises 1,100 feet above its surroundings is known as Potato Hill. It is a volcanic vent of undetermined age. Early residents called it Spud Hill, and the most optimistic referred to it as Mt. Deary. Two forested reservoirs are nearby and offer camping, hunting, fishing and hiking. While visiting, be sure to stop by Brush Creek Creamery and local bakery The Pie Safe for some unforgettable treats!

GENESEEE, IDAHO 21 MINUTE DRIVE

Visit Genesee and enjoy historic buildings downtown, take a drive to admire the beautiful rolling hills of wheat, barley, garbanzo beans, peas and lentils, or grab a coffee at the local coffeehouse, Stomping Grounds. Another great adventure is to visit the national historic site, White Springs Ranch. Take a trip back in time and see the circa 1876 log cabin and the 1884-1904 farm home. Genesee Community Day, the second Saturday of June, draws families to enjoy the car show, basketball tournament, quilt show, or the Cow Creek Run.

JULIAETTA, IDAHO 36 MINUTE DRIVE

Visitors love to stop by the historical Bank of Juliaetta, now known as the "First Bank of Pizza" and admire the original ceiling and safe, while enjoying homemade pizza. Guests are welcome to tour the privately-owned Castle Museum, constructed by Abraham A. Adams in the early 1900s. Today the museum's rooms are filled with a collection of antiques and artifacts relating to local and Pacific Northwest history. Visitors can also venture to Colter's Creek Winery for a wine tasting and delicious meal.

KENDRICK, IDAHO 33 MINUTE DRIVE

Founded by Thomas Kirby in 1889, Kendrick's rich history can still be enjoyed today. Visitors can admire many of the historic buildings on Main Street, tour the Bethany and Leland Churches, pull over to investigate the basalt columns, or shop at one of the many antique shops downtown. Kendrick also welcomes visitors from all over the country to their annual Locust Blossom Festival, which is held the last Saturday of May.

POTLATCH, IDAHO 24 MINUTE DRIVE

Potlatch is one of the most unique towns in all of Idaho. In 1905, Weyerhaeuser-organized the Potlatch Lumber Company and began building the largest white pine lumber mill of the day. To accommodate the many hundreds of workers needed to run the mill, the company built its own town, complete with houses, stores, schools, churches and a gymnasium. Visitors today will find many remnants of company town days, such as rows of tidy, identical homes, though the company long ago divested its interests. To learn more, visit the Potlatch Historical Society, housed in the beautifully restored W.I.&M. Depot. The spectacular scenery surrounding Potlatch consists of deep pine forests and grassy meadows, clear rivers and streams, providing year-round recreational opportunities. Potlatch provides accommodations for hunting, fishing, camping and other activities.



TROY, IDAHO 18 MINUTE DRIVE

Troy played an important role in the early commercial history of Latah County. Thanks to the arrival of the railroad around 1890, Troy served as a center of trade for both agriculture and lumber. Today the community is a fun place for visitors to stop and check out the local shops downtown, picnic in the park, or enjoy the Latah Trail that connects Troy to Moscow. The community of Troy also has fun family events throughout the year.

HEAD OUT WEST

PALOUSE, WASHINGTON 20 MINUTE DRIVE

Grab a BBQ sandwich and a brew at Palouse Caboose, take a river walk down Shady Lane, or enjoy some of the many shopping opportunities that can be found in the charming town of Palouse! There are excellent antiquing opportunities and a wide array of goods from local artisans. Palouse is known for its signature community events throughout the year. If you can, try to catch Palouse Days, Haunted Palouse or the Cabin Fever Brewfest!

PULLMAN, WASHINGTON 15 MINUTE DRIVE

With a population of 33,000, Pullman offers spectacular natural beauty plus urban amenities due to Washington State University, which occupies one-third of the town. Pullman has a fresh, small town feel, and the locals are welcoming and excited that you are exploring their town.

Gesa Field at Martin Stadium - Home of Pac-12 Cougar Football, take a stroll across campus and revel in WSU athletics.

Ferdinand's Ice Cream Shoppe - WSU's gourmet ice cream shop features old-fashioned ice cream made from the WSU Creamery.

WSU Bear Center - During the non-hibernating period (*approx. April-October*), the bears are visible from a viewing area where visitors can watch bears foraging, playing in the exercise yard, splashing in the pool, or lounging in outside runs.

HARVESTING ON THE HILLS

Moscow sits in the heart of the Palouse, an area known for its deep topsoil and fertile fields. For well over 100 years, this region has been known for its ability to produce an abundance of dryland crops, grown without supplemental irrigation. In early spring, the rolling hills are emerald green as the crops emerge. As summer arrives, the fields turn dark green and brilliant yellow. By mid-to-late summer, the hills are brushed with gold and amber, and harvest begins.

Looking out over the landscape, spring and winter wheats can be seen growing in rotation with barley, dry peas, lentils, garbanzo beans (chickpeas), and canola.

In fact, the Palouse is one of the most productive regions in the world for growing pulses, a term used to describe legumes like dry peas, lentils, and chickpeas. Growers are also expanding into the world of artisan grains, producing unique varieties of ancient wheat, barley and spelt for local craft bakeries, breweries, and distilleries.

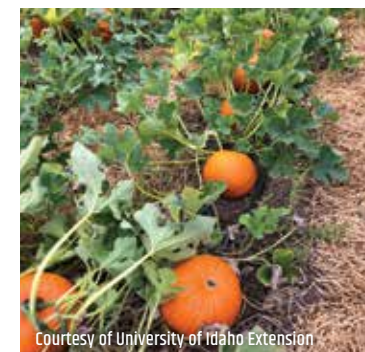
Most of the region's dryland agriculture products are exported, including about 90% of all wheat grown in the area. Countries that buy Palouse area wheat include Japan, Taiwan, and other Pacific Rim countries.

The Palouse also has a vibrant local food sector. Nestled amidst the rolling hills are fields of hay, lush pastures, and a growing number of small farms raising livestock and crops for local markets. On steep slopes and low valleys, small herds of cattle and sheep graze, goats forage and hogs root through pastures. Small farms, that range from a quarter to ten or more acres raise apples, pears, cherries, flowers, spring greens, tomatoes, garlic, and a wide variety of other fresh market vegetables. Moscow's urban market gardens and farm stands provide residents and visitors access to local vegetables, eggs, cheese, and flowers throughout the growing season.

Taste the bounty of Palouse agriculture by visiting one of the region's Saturday or mid-week farmers markets, dining at one of the year-round farm-to-table restaurants or shopping at the Moscow Food Co-Op. ■
